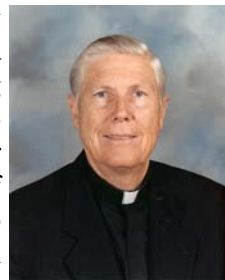

MY VIEW ON THE DAY OF THE FUNERAL

I was up early Saturday morning. There was a lot to do, including making sure I had everything to go because after 10:00 am and the transfer of the body to the church, too many things would happen in sequence. In discussions the previous night, it was determined that I would baptize the baby of the deceased, Hans Chris Nicholson. I talked with the girl and Carl, the Deacon Candidate, and she would go through the Baptismal instructions with her sponsors after the funeral. Since a priest only comes at the most every 6 weeks, this would be a good time to baptize the baby and hopefully be an inspiration to the family to a deeper Faith. The mother's brother (24) had died just the year before in a drowning accident. In fact, they are going to have the one year memorial at Kalskag on the Sunday I arrive.



To my dear Patty and our Baptismal team, I really appreciate all that you do, not only in the classes but also during the ceremony.

So, I met the family at the house, did the ritual of the transfer of the body, then went in procession to the church for the viewing until the 2:00 pm Mass. Yes, it again is an uncov-

ered casket. We had the baptism at 12:00 noon with our usual ceremony. To my dear Patty and our Baptismal team, I really appreciate all that you do, not only in the classes but also during the ceremony. They try to do the same things up here, but adapt to the situations as best they can. Of course, this was a sad occasion done in front of the open casket and with no singing. It was a powerful moment to talk about the life and death aspects of our Baptism and the significance of the placing of the Pall on the casket representing our Baptismal garment. We finished in time for the gathering of the community. The church was full of the whole community, Catholics, Christians, and Russian Orthodox. It was the usual ceremony we do, but with these exceptions. Part of the beginning was to place the lid on the casket, to be able to place the pall over it with bible and cross. There was one eulogy which they wanted after my homily, but I changed it to after communion. I said

In Jesus' story of the farmer and his sons, everyone knows that the one who said he wouldn't work—but did—is way ahead of the one who said he would work—but didn't. "Talk is cheap." Heard that before?

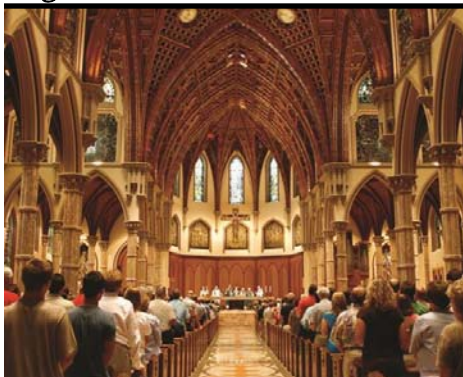

PREPARING FOR THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS

Why a New Translation?

On the First Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, Catholic parishes in the United States will begin praying the texts of the Mass using a new English translation of The Roman Missal. Many people have wondered why the Church is implementing a new translation of the prayers of the Mass. The Mass is the very core of Catholic life; its prayers express our Catholic beliefs. The more clearly we can express those beliefs, the more our faith can grow and be nourished. When the Mass was first translated into English some forty years ago, it was understood that the translation would have to be assessed and revised from time to time. Since then, a number of Church leaders, most prominently the late Blessed Pope John Paul II, have expressed the opinion that the 1960s translations of the Latin were done in haste. After the Second Vatican Council, when the Church throughout the world began praying the Mass in the languages of the people rather than in Latin, translations from the Latin were in immediate demand. In contrast, the new translation that we will now be using has taken nearly a decade to produce and, as Pope John Paul II desired, it is closer to the original Latin.

the last prayer and began the closing ceremony, but then I was motioned back to my seat. Off came the lid of the casket and then began the individual songs to Chris. Some had a guitar, most sang *a capella*, some were in English, and some in dialect. After the songs, the ceremony part of it was done and we walked out to a closing song at 3:45 pm.

Later, there was the viewing again and condolences to the family. Carl finally told them at 5:00 pm we have to leave. It was raining hard. Everyone went down to the boats for the trip across river to the cemetery. One boat had the casket and pall bearers. I packed away my light windbreaker and put on a 'float jacket' from the house. It was not only water repellent, but a life-jacket also. With that jacket, I had on my hat, hiking boots, plus my golf rain pants. Not your typical Priest garb for a grave-side service, but no one noticed. All the boats pulled into the muddy shore; they carried the casket to the top of the graveyard hill with all the people trudging after them, elders included. We got to the grave, which they had dug themselves, and then waited for everyone to gather. Someone forgot the rope to lower the casket and had to go all the way back to the boats. We were in the trees and when the wind blew, all the rain stored on the leaves dumped on us. I did our traditional ceremony and then they lowered the casket ingeniously with the rope and positioned it on the spruce limbs below. Then began the process of covering the casket which everyone took part in. The people with the shovels completed filling it in. Afterwards there was a big potluck in the community hall, but Carl told them it was 6:15 pm and they had to take me to Kalskag. We trudged down the hill, soaking wet, and got in the boat for our 1 ¼ hour ride to Kalskag.

We arrived at 7:45 pm to a muddy shore, popped out, got my bags, and went up the hill to the cold

church and living quarters. Fortunately one of their relatives lives behind the church. We went in and had hot tea to warm up. When we were done, we went over to the church. Carl showed me how to run the heaters, the water filtration system (they have a well) and turned on the hot water heater (an on demand system). So it is working. I took off my float jacket and gave it to him to take back.

This is the last I will see Carl and Angie. They have been so helpful. What a blessing they are to their people. Now I am here on my own again and thawing out. Dinner? They were right, there is nothing much in the living quarters. The store is not opened on Saturday or Sunday. They had some pasta on the shelf and I had a can of Italian stewed tomatoes. A modified Spaghetti. Sounds good to me. I had brought some tea bags and a little bottle of spirits. What more is needed? Now, I wonder what the character of this village will be? Next time.

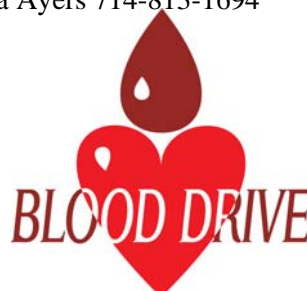

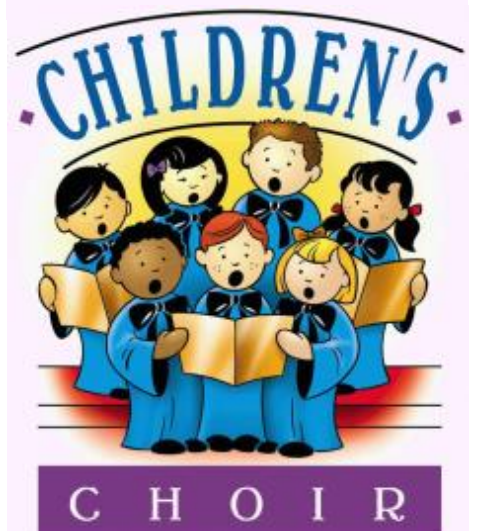
